**Biographical Sketch:**

Paul J. Frick, Ph.D., is currently Research Professor of Psychology and Chair of the Department of Psychology at the University of New Orleans. He is a Licensed Psychologist in the state of Louisiana. Dr. Frick’s research includes a range of topics under the broad rubric of developmental psychopathology. His work has been funded by the National Institute of Mental Health, Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention, and the John T. and Catherine D. MacArthur Foundation. One primary area of Dr. Frick’s research focuses on the causes and treatment of childhood conduct problems, aggression, and delinquency. A second area of research focuses on improving the diagnosis and classification of children’s emotional and behavioral disorders. From 1998–2000, Dr. Frick chaired a task force for the American Psychological Association Division 12 on Upgrading the Science and Technology of Assessment and Diagnosis. Dr. Frick is the editor of the Journal of Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology, the official journal of Division 53 of the American Psychological Association which is the Society of Clinical Child and Adolescent Psychology. Dr. Frick obtained his BS degree in psychology from Louisiana State University and his MS and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Georgia in Clinical Psychology.
