Biographical Sketch:

Dr. Todd is the Blanche F. Ittleson Professor of Psychiatry, the Director of the William Greenleaf Eliot Division of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Professor of Genetics at the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis MO. Presently Dr. Todd is an Attending Physician and Chief at St. Louis Children's Hospital and an Attending Physician at Barnes-Jewish Hospital in St. Louis. He is also a Visiting Scientist of Queensland Institute of Medical Research in Brisbane, Australia. He has been selected by his peers for the Best Doctors in America, 2002-present and America's Top Doctors, Castle Connolly Medical Limited, 2001-present.

His current clinical research interests cover such illnesses as autism spectrum disorders, behavior and affective disorders, suicidal ideation, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, inattentive/aggressive and anxious/depressed disorders, alcoholism and manic depressive. Presently he is a principal investigator on five active NIH, NIMH, NIAAA and/or NICHD funded grants and co-investigator on five currently active grants.

Dr. Todd has several editorial responsibilities including being a Deputy Editor on the Journal of the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. He is presently a field editor on the Neuropsychiatric Genetics (American Journal of Medical Genetics) Journal and he is on the editorial board for Biological Psychiatry, Psychiatric Genetics and Faculty of 1000 Medicine. Dr. Todd's experience also includes ad hoc reviews for the Journal of Neurochemistry, Archives of General Psychiatry, American Journal of Psychiatry, Journal of Autism and Developmental Disorders, Brain Research, Molecular Psychiatry and the American Journal of Human Genetics.

At his home institution Dr. Todd has served on the Washington University Medical School Executive Faculty Research Affairs Committee, the Subcommittee on Core Research Facilities Advisory Board, the General Medical and Pediatric Clinical Research Center, the St. Louis Children's Hospital Medical Executive Committee, the Department of Psychiatry Executive Committee, the Eli Robins Award Committee and the Barnes Jewish Center Behavioral Health Clinical Advisory Board.

Dr. Todd received a BA with a major in molecular biology in 1974 from Vanderbilt University in Nashville TN, his PhD in biology in 1977 from the University of Texas, Dallas and his MD in medicine from the University of Texas, San Antonio in 1981. He completed a residency in 1984 in general psychiatry at Stanford Medical School in Stanford CA and a child and adolescent psychiatry residency in 1986 from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. He is board certified in both Psychiatry (1988) and in Child Psychiatry and Psychiatry (1989). He holds a medical license in the state of Missouri.

In addition to his authorship of over 150 major peer-reviewed journal articles, Dr. Todd has also co-authored or edited 42 invited publications, authored one book and edited one book.
