**Biographical Sketch:**

Dr. Rauch is President and Psychiatrist in Chief of McLean Hospital and Chair of Psychiatry and Mental Health for the Partners Health Care System, as well as Professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School. His principal research interests relate to neuroimaging and the neurobiology of anxiety disorders.

Dr. Rauch received his undergraduate degree with honors in Neuroscience from Amherst College and attended medical school at the University of Cincinnati. He completed his residency training and a chief residency in Psychiatry as well as a Radiology Research Fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) in affiliation with Harvard Medical School. He subsequently completed the Clinical Investigator Training Program Fellowship offered by the Harvard-MIT Division of Health Sciences and Technology.

Dr. Rauch served on the faculty at MGH for over 15 years, during which time he founded the Psychiatric Neuroimaging Research Program, the Psychiatric Neurotherapeutics Program, and the Psychiatric Neuroscience Division.

Dr. Rauch and his colleagues have been leaders in delineating the neurocircuitry of anxiety disorders as well as pioneers in developing surgical and device-based treatments for obsessive compulsive and mood disorders. Dr. Rauch has contributed over 250 publications to the scientific literature and serves on the editorial boards of ten journals. He has garnered research support from various sources, including continuous funding from NIMH since the time he was a trainee. For his contributions to psychiatric neuroscience, he has won numerous honors, including the Joel Elkes Award of the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology. He also received the Barger Award for excellence in mentoring at Harvard Medical School.
