Dr. Bogels is full professor in developmental psychopathology at the University of Amsterdam, and director of UvA-Virenze, an academic treatment centre for children and parents with mental disorders. She is a registered health psychologist and psychotherapist for adults as well as children, specialized in cognitive-behavior therapy and mindfulness. She is also trained as a marital and family therapist.

Her main research interests are (i) the etiology, maintenance and treatment of social anxiety disorder in general and fear of blushing, trembling and sweating in particular; (ii) the intergenerational transmission of anxiety disorders, with a particular focus on the role of the father, and (iii) treatment of childhood anxiety disorders.

Her research group is conducting lab-based studies on the development of anxiety from babyhood, investigating the role of parental anxiety disorders and parental rearing, in interaction with infant temperament. In the academic treatment centre that she initiated, the treatment of anxiety disorders from early childhood on (3-18 years) is studied, with a particular focus on the role of parents. Moreover, she has developed innovative interventions such as mindful parenting and mindfulness for children with externalizing disorders, which are being investigated.

She graduated at the University of Groningen in Clinical Psychology, did a PhD in educational psychology at Maastricht University, and received her clinical training at the community mental health centre in Maastricht.
