Biographical Sketch:

Professor Eric Taylor, M.B. is Head of the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Department of the Institute of Psychiatry in King's College, London; and chairs an inter-disciplinary research group in KCL on the childhood problems that lead to poor adult mental health, and the child disorders section of the Biomedical Research Centre. His personal research interests are in childhood hyperkinesis, psychopharmacology and neuropsychiatric conditions in childhood. This currently takes him into neuroimaging and experimental psychological studies, molecular genetics, clinical nosography, longitudinal epidemiology, treatment trials and community surveys of needs for treatment. The research has been supported mostly by the Medical Research Council; and also by Wellcome, NIHR, and National Health Service. The theme is to track the development of impulsiveness and inattention so as to intervene effectively. In the NHS, he does clinical work at the Maudsley Hospital with special interests in hyperactivity and other neuropsychiatric conditions; and is lead clinician for the outpatient teams at the Maudsley. He is a non-executive director of the South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust, a Trustee of the National Academy of Parenting Practitioners, chairs the Paediatric Psychopharmacology Group, the Child Psychiatry Research Society and a Guidelines Development Group for the National Institute of Clinical Excellence. He has been Vice-Dean and Deputy Registrar of the Royal College of Psychiatrists, and a Trustee of the Psychiatry Research Trust. He is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians, the Royal College of Psychiatrists, and the Academy of Medical Sciences.

He is past Editor of the *Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry*, and an editor of *European Child and Adolescent Psychiatry* and *Behavioral and Brain Functions*. Publications include 6 books, mostly for parents and professionals on hyperactivity; more than 200 scientific papers on attention, hyperactivity, psychopharmacology, neuropsychiatry and related topics; and (as co-editor with Michael Rutter) the third, fourth (and forthcoming fifth) editions of the textbook "Child and Adolescent Psychiatry".

His undergraduate education was at the University of Cambridge; postgraduate fellowship at Harvard University; specialty training at The Middlesex Hospital, London and The Maudsley Hospital; research training at the Institute of Psychiatry.
