Dr. Hoek is Professor of Psychiatry at University Medical Center Groningen (the Netherlands) and has an adjunct position as Professor of Epidemiology at Columbia University, New York. He is director of the psychiatric residency program and chairman of the Department of Research and Training at Parnassia Psychiatric Institute, The Hague, a large mental health institute in the Netherlands (7000 employees).

Dr. Hoek is past president of the Eating Disorders Research Society. His main publications relate to the epidemiology of eating disorders and schizophrenia and the effects of prenatal famine. Hans Hoek is an editorial board member for *The International Journal of Eating Disorders*, *European Eating Disorders Review*, and *Eating and Weight Disorders*. He is editor-in-chief of a Dutch website for psychiatrists. Dr. Hoek is a consultant for the WHO (Task Force on Disability Assessment and International Classification of Functioning).

Dr. Hoek received his medical degree from Groningen University (the Netherlands), completed his psychiatric residency at University Medical Center Groningen and followed a psychiatric epidemiology training program at Columbia University New York. He completed a Ph.D. in Psychiatric Epidemiology.
