**Insert Brief Biographical Sketch:**

Dr. Alarcón is currently Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Psychology at Mayo Clinic College of Medicine, Consultant in Psychiatry at Mayo Clinic, and Medical Director of the Mood Disorders Unit, Mayo Psychiatry and Psychology Treatment Center (MPPTC) in Rochester, MN. Between 1993 and 2002, he was Chief of the Mental Health Service Line at the Atlanta VA Medical Center, and Professor and Vice Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences, Emory University School of Medicine, in Atlanta, GA. He is Senior Editor of the standard psychiatric textbook in Latin America, and of the three-volume Ibero-American Encyclopedia of Psychiatry. Co-Editor of *Archivos de Psiquiatría*, the oldest psychiatric journal in Spain, member of the Publications Committee of the World Psychiatric Association., and of the Editorial Boards of 18 psychiatric journals in the United States, Latin America and Europe. He is a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association, Fellow of the American College of Psychiatrists, Member of the American Psychopathological Association, and former Chair of the Cultural Psychiatry Committee of the Group for the Advancement of Psychiatry. He was also a member of the NIMH/APA-sponsored Research in Psychiatric Diagnosis Group (2001-2002), and Chair of its Cultural Issues Work Group. Former President of the American Society of Hispanic Psychiatry, member of NIMH's Clinical Centers and Special Projects Review Committee. He is also a member of the Mental Health Task Force of the Carter Center in Atlanta, Visiting Professor in several Latin American Universities, Honorary member of several psychiatric and professional organizations in the continent, he was the recipient of APA's Simon Bolivar Award in 1999. A Corresponding Member of Perú's National Academy of Medicine, he is author or co-author of over 200 peer-reviewed articles, 14 books, and 60 book chapters, mostly in the areas of Diagnosis and Nosology, Mood and Personality Disorders, and Cultural Psychiatry.

A native from Arequipa, Perú, Dr. Alarcón received his MD degree from the Universidad Peruana Cayetano Heredia (UPCH) in Lima, and had his residency in psychiatry at the Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore. He also received his Master in Public Health degree from the Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. Back in Peru, he was appointed as Assistant Professor and Director of the Psychiatric Residency Training Program at UPCH. Between 1976-1979, he was Associate Dean of the Medical School, and Director of Academic Affairs. In 1980, he returned to the United States as Visiting Professor of Psychiatry in the School of Medicine at the University of Alabama in Birmingham (UAB). In 1982, he was appointed Chief of the Inpatient Psychiatry Service at University Hospital, and in 1991, Director of the Affective Disorders Program at UAB.
