Susan K. Schultz M.D. is a Professor of Psychiatry at the University of Iowa Carver College of Medicine. She joined the University of Iowa faculty in 1995, and has conducted research on the treatment of dementia and psychosis in late life, as well as brain imaging in persons with cognitive decline. She has board qualifications in Geriatric Psychiatry and Psychosomatic Medicine from the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology.

Dr. Schultz is affiliated with the University of Iowa Center on Aging where she serves as Associate Director for Clinical Research. She is active in the mentorship of junior colleagues interested in aging research including emotional dysregulation in late life and treatment interventions for dementia. Dr. Schultz serves as a deputy editor for the American Journal of Psychiatry, is a member of an NIH review group, and the ABPN Geriatric Certification Committee.

Dr. Schultz received her bachelor's degrees in Biology and English from Nebraska Wesleyan University and her medical degree from the University of Nebraska Medical Center. She completed residency training at the University of Iowa Department of Psychiatry followed by a research fellowship in the Neurobiology of Schizophrenia and Psychotic Disorders at the University of Iowa Mental Health Clinical Research Center.
