Insert Brief Biographical Sketch:

Lori Brotto has a PhD in clinical psychology from the University of British Columbia (UBC) and completed a Fellowship in Reproductive and Sexual Medicine from the University of Washington. She is currently an Assistant Professor in the UBC Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Division of Gynaecologic Oncology, as well as a registered psychologist in Vancouver, Canada. She is the director of the UBC Sexual Health Laboratory where research primarily focuses on developing and testing psychological /psychoeducational interventions for women with sexual desire and arousal difficulties. Other major lines of research include exploring sexuality and reproductive health in ethnic minority women, studying the intracrinology of androgen metabolites in women's desire, asexuality, and sexuality in advanced ovarian cancer. Her research team consists of two full-time study coordinators, graduate students in clinical psychology, research assistants, a study nurse, and numerous volunteers. There are currently two dozen studies actively underway with funding from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research, the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research, the BC Cancer Agency, the BC Medical Services Foundation, Hampton, and OvCaRe.

Dr. Brotto has 34 peer-reviewed publications, 15 book chapters in print or in press, 10 papers in preparation, 51 invited presentations, two dozen conference paper presentations, 34 conference poster presentations, and numerous literary works in non-peer reviewed formats. She also frequently conducts media interviews for in print and on-line sources.

Her clinical work focuses on individuals and couples with sexual dysfunction. Dr. Brotto has a particular interest in sexuality of women with cancer or other chronic medical illnesses. She also trains gynaecology residents and medical students at UBC and teaches an undergraduate course in Human Sexuality in the Department of Psychology at UBC.

She is Associate Editor for Sexual and Relationship Therapy, and on the Editorial Boards of the Archives of Sexual Behavior, the Journal of Sex and Marital Therapy, and the International Journal of Sexual Health. She is an ad-hoc reviewer for 12 different sexuality and social science journals. Dr. Brotto is the recipient of a Scholar Career Award from the Michael Smith Foundation for Health Research as well as a New Investigator Award from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. She is actively involved with the Clinical Trials Group for the National Cancer Institute of Canada, serving as Quality of Life Liaison for the Gynaecology group. In this capacity, she is centrally involved in designing protocols for experimental chemotherapy, radiation therapy, and surgical treatments that include quality of life measurement. Dr. Brotto is also on the Sexual Dysfunctions Subcommittee of the DSM-V Workgroup.
