Biographical Sketch:

Francis Creed has been Professor of Psychological Medicine in the Division of Psychiatry at the University of Manchester, UK since 1997. He has directed his research efforts towards evaluating the aetiology and treatment for somatisation and psychological disorders associated with physical disease. He also served as Research Dean for the Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing and Pharmacy at the University 1997-2001, as Director of Research & Development for the Manchester Mental Health & Social Care Trust (2002-4), as a member of the U.K. *Medical Research Council* Advisory Board and as President of the European Association of Consultation-Liaison Psychiatry and Psychosomatics. He is an elected Fellow of the Academy of Medical Sciences and is European Editor of the *Journal of Psychosomatic Research*.

Francis Creed served as Co-Chair of the Psychosocial committee for Rome Working Team Report on Functional Bowel Disorder 2005/6. He serves on the UK National Institute of Clinical Excellence committee concerning the treatment of depression in people with chronic physical health problems 2008. On behalf of the Association of European Psychiatrists he runs a CME Workshop: "Detecting and treating depression in general Medical settings". He is President of Manchester Medical Society 2007-8.

Francis Creed's research areas include: psychological interventions for the Irritable Bowel Syndrome; aetiology and treatment of depression in association with physical illness (myocardial infarction and cancer) and depression in ethnic minorities and in developing countries. Recent findings include: i) Psychological treatments improve health related quality of life in severe irritable bowel syndrome, ii) Depression is associated with worse outcome following myocardial infarction and iii) Depression is common in Pakistan and in people of Pakistani origin living in UK. Current research is investigating the risk factors for somatisation in a population-based sample, the role of depression and social variables in predicting poor outcome in several chronic diseases and ways of helping depression in a) older women of Pakistani origin living in UK and b) postnatal women in Pakistan.
