Biographical Sketch:

Nancy Frasure-Smith received a PhD in Social Relations from the Johns Hopkins University and completed an NIMH Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Psychology at McGill University. She is currently Professor of Psychiatry at McGill University, Senior Research Associate at the Montreal Heart Institute, Adjunct Professor of Nursing at McGill University, and Invited Researcher at the Centre hospitalier de l'Université de Montréal (CHUM). Her research, conducted in conjunction with D^r. François Lespérance of Université de Montréal, examines the importance of depression and other psychological and social factors in the development and prognosis of cardiovascular disease, the physiological and behavioral links between depression and cardiovascular disease, and developing and evaluating interventions to change the impact of the depression and other psychological factors in cardiac patients. Recent publications have appeared in the *Archives of General Psychiatry*, *JAMA*, and *Biological Psychiatry*.
