Dr. Bucholz is Professor of Psychiatry at Washington University School of Medicine. A psychiatric genetic epidemiologist, her current research interests are in the development of and course of alcoholism and comorbid phenotypes, including the influences exerted by genes and environment, and in ethnic differences in this unfolding. She is currently PI of two NIH-funded projects, one an NIAAA-funded study of birth- record- ascertained samples of families at high and low risk of alcohol dependence which includes an oversample of African American families (AA12640), and the other a NIDA-funded study (DA14363) that employs the novel offspring of twins design, using offspring from twin father pairs where both members, one member or neither member of the twin pair are affected with drug and alcohol dependence. She is an investigator in the longstanding Collaborative Study of Genetics of Alcoholism and in the Midwest Alcoholism Research Center. She serves on the RSA Board of Directors, is an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs*, and is on the Editorial Board of *Alcoholism: Clinical and Experimental Research*.

She received her bachelor's degree from Yale College, a master's of public health and Ph.D. in epidemiology from Yale University, and an Master of Psychiatric Epidemiology from Washington University. She completed her postdoctoral training with John E. Helzer, M.D. and Lee N. Robins Ph.D. at Washington University School of Medicine.
