**Brief Biographical Sketch:**

Dr. Petry is Professor at University of Connecticut Health Center, where she directs the Gambling Treatment and Research Center and Behavioral Cardiovascular Prevention in the Calhoun Cardiology Center. Dr. Petry’s research interests lie in the use of behavioral therapy, especially contingency management interventions, for improving outcomes of substance abusers and enhancing adherence to health behaviors. In addition, she leads a clinical research program investigating treatments and prevention strategies for pathological gambling. Her work is funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse, the National Institute of Mental Health, and the National Institute on Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism. Dr. Petry serves as a consultant and regular reviewer for the National Institute of Health, and she is on the editorial boards of six academic journals. She is a member of the College on Problems of Drug Dependence and a fellow of the American Psychological Association. Dr. Petry earned her Ph.D. in Psychology from Harvard University in 1994.
